Program Overview

At Camp Jabez on the Cumberland we want our internship program to serve two purposes. One purpose is to provide needed staff for the summer camps and guest groups. The other purpose is to provide an opportunity for interns to learn and grow from all the different activities that you as a team will help research, plan, prepare, and execute in this program.

Some of the activities you will be involved in include but are not limited to:

- Much of the planning, preparations, and execution of our weeks of summer camp
- Helping us find counselors, volunteers, and helpers
- Helping train and mentor the counselors
- Meal preparation
- Cleaning before and after groups
- Assisting when we have guest groups on site
- Training and certification on the ziplines and giant swing
- Optional lifeguard certification
- Grounds keeping
- Contacting people on our long list of Angel Tree kids
- Helping to promote and market our camp to attract campers
- Leading devotion times
- Etc., Etc., Etc.

These activities along with dedicated time for bible studies, devotions, prayer, and just plain fun should provide any intern with a well-rounded experience.

Program Details

Program Weeks

The program will start the first Monday of June and run 9 weeks ending the first Friday of August.

Work Hours

The actual days on site each week will vary during the summer depending on guest groups and other scheduled activities. As the time gets closer and camps get booked we will make a schedule to reference. We ask each intern to be flexible when possible as needs often vary. Each intern will be given 2 days off most weeks. The intern can decide for themselves if he/she wants to stay on site or go home for the off days. During the work week we want the interns to stay on site as this will help them to bond together as a team. Camp Jabez can be somewhat flexible for interns that need to have specific time off during the summer.

Accommodations

We are expecting to have 2-4 male interns and 2-4 female interns. You will be sharing a space with another intern of your gender. There will be a specific cabin or space for each team of interns. In a shared space there will be at least a small refrigerator, microwave, and coffee maker. The interns are responsible for keeping their space clean, there will be inspections. Internet access will be available. There may be times during the summer that you will need to change locations depending on the needs of the camp at that time. During our weeks of camp, the interns may be required to stay in the dorms with the campers depending on the counselor staffing.

Meals

Much of the time, meals will be provided along with the meals we prepare for the guests, other times you may need to prepare the meals for yourselves with the food we have available in the kitchen. We will not let you go hungry and we will work with you to try and have what you want to eat.

Transportation

You are responsible for your own travel to and from camp. When there are groups at the camp you may not use your personal vehicle for travel around the camp. When there are no groups you may use your vehicle if you choose to move from area to area. There will also be limited use of a camp golf cart especially when doing grounds keeping work.

Compensation

Interns will be paid a weekly stipend of \$350. This will be subject to taxes or you are given an IRS form 1099 and processed through our standard payroll service.
